

# Environmental Law and the Challenges of the Decades Ahead:

Promoting Transformative and Recovery Responses to the Planetary Emergency

VI Tarragona International Environmental Law Colloquium (TIEC) 14, 15 and 16 June 2021 - Universitat Rovira i Virgili (Tarragona)

## Concept

In 2020, the consequences of the process of the aggressive colonization of the planet began to be perceived in a threatening way due to the pandemic outbreak. In this regard, it has been shown that human induced climate change and biodiversity loss are playing a relevant role in the spread of zoonotic diseases, like the SARS outbreak in 2003, the spill-over of the ebola virus, and the spread of COVID-19 in 2020. In this vein, the COVID-19 pandemic not only emphasizes interdependence between human economy and wellbeing, and the ecosystems, but also puts the spotlight on the consequences that human actions are having on humans, non-human species, and also on the environment. Due to the human-environment interdependence, the COVID-19 crisis has had cascading effects on the economy and exacerbated existing social and gender inequalities, violence, and injustices.

All this seems to suggest a **complete failure of the adaptation and mitigation system** in the face of a planetary emergency.
